

GRANADA EVERLAND EXPEDITION

TRAVEL ITINERARY – BRAZIL TO CANADA

Type of trip: Tourism and cultural exploration through the Americas

Vehicle: Chevrolet S10 pickup truck equipped with a camper (motorhome)

Estimated travel period: May 2026 – December 2027

Summary of the trip

Overland journey across the American continent, starting in Brazil and heading north to Alaska (USA), with the Canada segment as part of the northern route. The goal is to explore diverse cultures, landscapes, and peoples of the Americas while documenting the experience through photos and videos for our travel project 'Granada Everland.'

Main travel stages

Month/Year	Country / Region	Notes and points of interest
May 2026	Departure from Brazil	Beginning of the expedition. Leaving southern Brazil heading north.
Jun 2026	Bolivia and Peru	Visiting La Paz, Lake Titicaca, and Cusco.
Jul–Aug 2026	Ecuador and Colombia	Overland crossing and preparation for RORO shipping to Central America.
Sep 2026	Panama and Costa Rica	Continuation through Central America.
Oct–Dec 2026	Mexico	Visiting historical and cultural regions (Mexico City, Baja California).

Jan–Mar 2027	United States	Northbound journey to the Canadian border.
Apr–Jul 2027	CANADA	Expected entry through British Columbia (Vancouver). Planned route to Yukon, visiting Vancouver, Banff, Jasper, and Whitehorse.
Aug–Oct 2027	ALASKA (USA)	Northernmost destination of the expedition.
Nov–Dec 2027	Return route	Return journey through Canada and southern countries.

Estimated time in Canada

Approximate duration: 2 to 3 months

Purpose: Tourism and exploration of natural and cultural sites.

No intention to work, study, or reside in Canada.

Additional notes

- The couple travels in a self-contained vehicle, equipped for sleeping and cooking.
- The route is flexible according to weather and border conditions.
- All travel expenses will be covered by personal savings and retirement income, as shown in the attached financial documents.
- The applicants maintain strong ties to Brazil, including residence and property, and will return after the expedition.
